Historical Office building comes on the market for the first time in over a quarter of a century

The Tithe Barn on Church Road in Thame is certainly a building of great rarity. Not only is it a well-known 16th Century Grade II* listed building of particular architectural significance sitting adjacent to St Marys Church in the Conservation Area, but it has also been in the same occupation for the last 28 years.

The building was painstakingly renovated in the early 1980's by the present owner, who is a qualified architect.

The unassuming solid wooden front door leads into a full height reception, providing the first glimpse of the magnificent double-queen-post beams and open 'cathedral' ceilings. The ground floor accommodates the toilets, modern fitted kitchen meeting rooms and storage, whilst the first floor is a mixture of open plan and cellular offices. The building also offers many modern comforts, such as air conditioning. Moreover, the town centre is within easy walking distance.

"This is a building of superlatives", comments David Williams of the letting agents, Meeson Williams. "From the outside, the setting and exquisite architectural detail makes an impressive first impression, and when inside, the sympathetic exposure of the building's skeleton which has been carefully integrated with the office use, does not disappoint."
